

Community Profile – Cwmbach

Cwmbach is a small village just across from Aberdare. At one end is Aberdare train station and Abernant and at the

other is Cefnpennar. Cwmbach means 'Little Valley' in Welsh (Cwm = valley, Bach = little). Cwmbach has a population

of 5,117




Prior to the industrial revolution, Cwmbach consisted of a number of farms and homesteads; in the mid-19th century it became a significant coal mining community. Aberdare is a town in the Cynon valley area of Rhondda Cynon Taf. Aberdare is 4 miles south-west of Merthyr Tydfil, 20 miles north west


of Cardiff and 22 miles east north east of Swansea.

The village is served by Aberdare railway station and Aberdare bus station, opposite each other in the town centre. As the collieries expanded so did the village of Cwmbach. However, the closures of the pits (the final colliery Lletty Shenkin closed in 1922) resulted in high emigration and poverty. In the 1950s Cwmbach prospered with a large number of new council houses that were built at the lower end of Cwmbach and to the south. This housing stock was transferred to RCT Homes in 2010 a private not for profit social housing provider. The 1950s also brought building on the site of the former Pant Farm; these were all private houses made of up houses and bungalows.

Today's Cwmbach is a mixture of both social and private housing. An area known as Tirfounder Fields was cleared in 2001 for a retail park including Asda and several other shops as well as a large new build estate. In Cwmbach, the 1st Cooperative Shop in Wales was established in 1850.

		The town is served by Aberdare railway station and Aberdare bus station, opposite each other in the town centre. It takes
		about 4 minutes to walk from Aberdare train station to the Aberdare bus station. The train service runs between Monday to
		Saturday, daytimes, the service from Aberdare is a half-hourly service to Barry Island, via Cardiff Queen Street. In the evenings
		this drops to hourly and certain late-night trains run to Penarth rather than Barry Island. On Sundays there is a general 2-hourly service to Barry Island with an hourly service in the morning and in the late afternoon. There are regular buses to the local
		villages of Penywaun, Cwmbach and Penderyn, there are buses to Merthyr Tydfil, Pontypridd and Cardiff 7 days a week.

		 Cwmbach Railway Tunnel looks set to open: Currently looking at the lighting within the tunnel and carrying out bat surveys. The Tunnel will be for cycling and walking. Tunnel Cottages at Blaen Nant Yr Groes Farm – Self-catering holidays. Ynyscynon Inn – Very popular with families and for Sunday meals. Coed Morgannwg Way passes through Cwmbach. Llwydcoed to Cwmbach Railway Path open for walkers The Cynon Trail runs to Cwmbach (from Mountain Ash to Cwmbach). Heritage Trail board describing Abernant –Yr –Groes as the first Cynon Valley Deep Mine Coalmine 1837 – 1895 Aberdare Canal comes through Cwmbach Brodeg Woodland Trail looked after by Tre-Telynog Environmental Group supported by Trivallis. Friends of Cwmbach Wetlands are accruing the wetlands (Tir Founder), and local people will be able to buy shares. The Wetlands will become a nature reserve, educational centre and café: 'Parts of Ynys Cynon and Tirfounder Fields are defined as S.I.N.C. (Sites of Importance for Nature Conservation) and support a wide variety of birds, insects and plants. Some notable examples are otter, mink, kingfisher, dipper, willow tit, bogbean, lesser water plantain, six dragonfly species and a variety of wading birds and summer migrants'.
